2000 USA CROSS COUNTRY WINTER NATIONALS GREENSBORO, NORTH CAROLINA FEBRUARY 12-13, 2000

JUNIOR COMPETITION

Race Conditions: 42 degrees with steady rain and winds 5-10 mph. The course is wet and muddy with sizeable puddles throughout.

Race In Review: The first mile was passed in 5:43 by Sheila Agrawal. By the end of the first 2 kilometers, a pack of four ran together including Lauren Fleshman, Shalane Flanagan, Agrawal and Erin Sullivan. Entering a sharp S-turn of 100 meters, all of which was underwater, the athletes continued into the second lap of the course. The lead pack of four ran together through the second loop, and splashed through the underwater section together. On the backstretch of the final loop, there was a gradual separation, but all ran strong races forming the nucleus of a strong junior team.

Shalane Flanagan - winner: Flanagan is a high school senior from Marblehead, MA. Will attend the University of North Carolina in the fall. She won the high school mile at the Millrose Games in New York last weekend. Flanagan's mother, the former Cheryl Bridges, is a five-time U.S. world cross country team member. Her best finish was fourth in 1969.

Flanagan quotes: "It was an awesome race. I thought the other girls were going to take it out and I was going to be fighting to make the top six. Those girls are awesome. I felt really good from the start and I just went with it. It's very muddy and very wet out there. I wanted to run a smart race and qualify for the world championships team. I didn't care what place I came in. It was like the weather at home so I felt right at home. The conditions didn't bother me at all I like it like this."

SENIOR MEN 4-KILOMETER CHAMPIONSHIP

Race Conditions: 42 degrees with steady rain and light winds. The course is wet and muddy with sizeable puddles throughout.

Race in Review: Through the chilly rain and wind on this waterlogged and muddy course, Adam Goucher amazed with a 4:29 first mile split. Robert Gary was 20 meters behind, followed by Mark Croghan in third. At the 2 kilometer point Goucher was still well in front, followed by Gary, Croghan and Jason Stewart, each separated by about 15 meters. Goucher continued to race strongly, extending his lead to the finish.

Adam Goucher - winner: In winning his second U.S. 4km cross country title in a row, Goucher continues to demonstrate that he is America's fastest rising middledistance star. At the 1999 U.S. Championships in Tacoma, Goucher won with an impressive 11-second victory over the rest of the field. At his first-ever IAAF World Cross Country Championships in March, Goucher placed 12th at 4000 meters. Later in 1999, Goucher won the 5000 meters at the USA Outdoor Championships and he finished and impressive 12th in that event at the IAAF World Outdoor Championships in Seville, Spain. He ended the '99 campaign ranked 7th in the U.S. in the 1500m, 2nd nationally in the 3000m and 2nd in the 5000 meters. Goucher won the 1998 NCAA Cross Country title as a junior at Colorado. In his spare time, Goucher likes playing the drums and flying sailplanes. He resides in Boulder, Colo.

Goucher quotes: "The course was absolutely terrible. My feet were frozen before I even started the race, just from being so wet. Through the course of the race I couldn't even push off. It felt like my shoes had fallen off, my feet were so cold. There's spots where the course is so muddy that it's like quicksand. You just slosh through there and it feels like you're not going anywhere. The weather made the race a lot tougher because it was soggy. You had no response when you take a step and you just sink in. It's crazy. I wanted to get out and get good position. The last thing you want to do is get boxed in and not have a chance to move. I've always loved cross country and it's a lot of fun. It's a totally different element. You race not only against the other competitors, but against the weather and the course."

Goals at the world championships: "My goal is to hopefully get into the top five. I'm training a lot harder and my training has been going really well. I've had a bit of a knee injury the last few weeks but it's not holding me back much. I'll probably take a couple of days off after this weekend and make sure it's better. I'll wait until tomorrow to decide if I'll run in the 12k race."

SENIOR WOMEN 8 KILOMETER CHAMPIONSHIP

Race Conditions : 40 degrees, wet and muddy with large puddles throughout the course. Light breeze, 5-10 mph.

Race in Review: The rain had stopped by the start of this women's race. The first 2 kilometers loop separated the pack, thanks to strong front running by Deena Drossin, who led by 20 meters at 2km. Jen Rhines was in second, followed by Joan Nesbit in third, and then Elva Dryer. Drossin's first mile time was 5:20. Nesbit soon dropped out, and over the next 2km loop the space between the top athletes slowly separated, and it was single-file with Drossin, Rines, Dryer, Rachel Sauder, Kim Fitchen, and Donna Garcia. The 4 kilometer split time was 13:35, the 5 kilometer split was 10:40, and by the end of six kilometers, Drossin's lead had extended to 38 seconds. These six maintained pace, splashing through the water and mud to the finish.

Deena Drossin - winner: Deena Drossin, who won seven Southeastern Conference championships as a collegian at Arkansas, captured her third 8km U.S. cross country title in a row with a dominating performance today in Greensboro. Drossin, who captured her second U.S. crown in Tacoma last year, ranked seventh nationally in the 5000 meters in 1998 by Track & Field News. Drossin finished the 1997 campaign ranked fourth nationally in the 10,000 meters. Following her success as last year's cross country nationals, Drossin enjoyed her best-ever outdoor campaign. She ended the season ranked nationally in three events --- the 3000 meters (3rd), 5000 meters (2rd) and 10,000 meters (#1). Drossin, who placed third at last year's U.S. Championships at 10,000 meters in Eugene and 11th at that event at the IAAF World Outdoor Championships in Seville, Spain, occasionally goes on training runs with her dog, Aspen, a chocolate lab. She placed 29th at the IAAF World Cross Country Championships at 6700 meters in 1997 and 29th at 8000 meters in 1998. Drossin finished 10th at last year's world championships in Belfast.

Drossin quotes: "I had a lot of confidence coming into this race. I have a lot of work to do between now and the world championships. The course was great. It was definitely a cross country race out there today with the weather conditions. It was really challenging in a variety of ways. It was tough out there, and I could tell that I was getting really fatigued. I put high expectations on myself, and a lot of people had high expectations of me, so going across the finish line I was doing it for my family and my coach. I've been training with a really fantastic group of athletes in San Diego the last month and they help push me day in and day out to a higher level. Each year I get a little bit stronger and each training season I'm getting stronger, so I'm hoping this year will be a good one for me."

JUNIOR MEN 8-KILOMETER CHAMPONSHIP NOTES & QUOTES

Race Conditions: 42 degrees -- course slick and muddy.

Franklyn Sanchez - winner: Sanchez will be 18 years old next month. He resides in Lynn, MA, and he is a graduate of Cushing Academy in Massachusetts. He has yet to choose a college.

Sanchez quotes: "I was really nervous before the race because of so many great runners like Louis Luchini in this race. Me and my coach just decided that we'd just try to hold on and wait to see what happens. I wanted to get a good sense of the course to see how tough it would be, and then what ever happens, happens. The course was tough for me. I've never really trained for a course like this, and I've been on the treadmill a lot because of all the snow we've had. I found a stride and I felt comfortable. I guess I just kept going. I ran in two indoor meets recently just to see how I was feeling. I'm lucky and very fortunate to do so well in this race. I was surprised to be so far ahead. I just wanted to come out here to compete and do the best I can. I'm really looking forward to the world championships."

SENIOR WOMEN 4-KILOMETER CHAMPIONSHIP

Race Conditions: 42 degrees -- course slick and muddy.

Deena Drossin - winner: By winning today's 4km U.S. title, Drossin has become the first ever to win the women's 8km and 4km titles at the USA Cross Country Championships. Drossin, who finished second to two-time defending 4km champ Amy Rudolph last year in Tacoma, took a commanding lead early this afternoon and ran away with the title. Drossin (13:30) won by a whopping 16-second margin over Rudolph who finished second. By winning yesterday's 8km race for the third time in a row, and with today's victory, Drossin has firmly established herself as the dominant force in U.S. women's cross country running. In addition, Drossin enjoyed her best-ever outdoor campaign last season. She ended the campaign ranked nationally in three events by Track & Field News, 3000 meters (3rd), 5000 meters (2rd) and 10,000 meters (#1). Drossin, who placed third at last year's U.S. Championships at 10,000 meters in Eugene and 11th at that event at the IAAF World Outdoor Championships in Seville, Spain, occasionally goes on training runs with her dog, Aspen, a chocolate lab. She placed 29th at the IAAF World Cross Country Championships at 6700 meters in 1997 and 29th at 8000 meters in 1998. Drossin finished 10th at last year's world championships in Belfast. Drossin resides in Alamosa, Colo.

Drossin quotes: "I felt Cheri (Kenah) and Amy (Rudolph) on me the whole time, and they didn't make the race easy on me by any means. I was gritting my teeth on every step. They gave me an honest race out there and this weekend is one of the strongest performances that I've ever had so I'm very pleased. Last year I just didn't have the strength behind me to carry out the second day. Amy is always a tough competitor and she gave me a race for the money last year and she did it again this year. I really worked hard this year, and the accumulation of strength training over the last couple of years has added up. In a 4K you just got to take it out hard and try to maintain as much as you can and that's what I did today."

On competing and winning today after such a tough race in brutal conditions yesterday: "The conditions weren't ideal but we were all in it. I respect all of the girls for getting on the starting line. A lot of people changed their minds when they saw the weather, but the girls who stepped up to the starting line yesterday and today put their hearts in it and I congratulate them."

On winning both titles in Greensboro: "This is very special for me because my training group has helped me tremendously over the last couple of months, and they made it possible for me. My parents have given me wonderful support over the years, and my sister called yesterday the longest two hours of her life because she had never been so cold, so for her to be out here supporting me really means a lot."

SENIOR MEN 12-KILOMETER CHAMPIONSHIP

Race Conditions: 42 degrees. Course wet and muddy.

Adam Goucher - winner: After winning his second 4km national title yesterday, Adam Goucher bounced back today to capture the 12km title in a dominating performance. With today's win, Goucher becomes the first man ever to win both U.S. cross country titles at the same event. As America's fastest rising middle-distance star, Goucher continues to add to an already impressive resume. At the 1999 U.S. Championships in Tacoma, Goucher won with an impressive 11-second victory over the rest of the field. At his first-ever IAAF World Cross Country Championships last March, Goucher placed 12th at 4000 meters. Later in 1999, Goucher won the 5000 meters at the USA Outdoor Championships and he finished an impressive 12th in that event at the IAAF World Outdoor Championships in Seville, Spain. He ended the '99 campaign ranked 7th in the U.S. in the 1500m, 2nd nationally in the 3000m and 2nd in the 5000 meters. Goucher won the 1998 NCAA Cross Country title as a junior at Colorado. In his spare time, Goucher likes playing the drums and flying sailplanes. He resides in Boulder, Colo.

Goucher Quotes: "I'm very happy. I felt pretty good yesterday and I said to myself that it didn't take that much out of me and yesterday's race felt pretty easy. I wanted to see how my knee felt and then just take it how it comes. I've been training great over the last six months since I got back from world championships, so I knew it would carry over although the last three weeks or so I needed to back off because of my knee (patella tendonitis). I was a little bit more tired and sore than I thought I'd be when I woke up this morning, and I didn't know if I would run today. I talked to Mark (coach Mark Wetmore) and I said this is fun, let's just go out and do it. So I went to warm up and it felt pretty good and when the gun went off I felt good and settled in and said this is great. I wanted to be in it and match any moves that were thrown at me and I didi it. The next thing I knew I had a big lead with about 2 1/2 laps to go. I was trying to utilize the dryer and firmer parts of the course. My coach and I had been talking about doubling for a long time and we thought I could do it. We wanted to come in here and give it a shot. Deena did it to which is awesome. I'm so excited for her. To win both is great, I'm extremely excited about it. At the world championships I'm just going to run the 4K."
